### Keynote speakers



**Professor Beverley Raphael, Professor Population Mental Health and Disasters, University of Western Sydney and Professor Psychological Medicine at the Australian National University and Emeritus Professor in Psychiatry from the University of Queensland**

She has been involved in the development of national mental health policy in Australia and is responsible for mental health policy and program development in New South Wales (NSW). She has a long-term involvement and expertise in research and management in the area of trauma, grief and disasters, and more recently response to terrorism and its mental health correlates and consequences. She is an internationally recognised expert in mental health response and disasters. This has included planning for the Sydney Olympics and response to the Bali Bombing. She has led the development of prevention and public health approaches to mental health and the implications of these for disasters and terrorism and has responsibility for coordinating national mental health responses to these events in Australia. She is chair of the National Working Party for Mental Health aspects for Terrorism and Disaster and is the current chair of the National Mental Health Disaster Taskforce which co-ordinated the National Mental Health response to the South East Asia Tsunami disaster. She is a consultant to WHO and other international groups.



**Paul Holman ASM, Operations Manager - Specialist Emergency Response Department, Ambulance Victoria**

Paul Holman, has a broad and diverse operational background and management experience within the Ambulance industry over 30 years. Operational experience as Paramedic in Mobile Intensive Care Ambulance, Air Ambulance, Helicopter, Communications and Field Management. Paul is currently the Operations Manager Specialist Emergency Response Department, Ambulance Victoria and is responsible for all Emergency Management and Planning encompassing CBR response, major incident management, the AV emergency response plan and the development and running of the AV Emergency Operations Centre. The department also is responsible for Mobile Intensive Care services (MICA) CBR, USAR and Emergency Management Training. Paul is a member of the Australian College of Ambulance Professionals – Victoria and holds a Graduate Diploma in Administration (Health) and was Awarded the Ambulance Service Medal (ASM) in 2007.
